THE FEMALE GAZE

THROUGH THE FEMALE GAZE: Women and Work in Italy since the 1950s brings together photographs taken or archived by women, from the 1950s until today.

The history of female photography and women's emancipation in Italy mirror one another, in the context of the broader transformation of Italian society.

The exhibition features over 160 images, together with important sources such as the loan from the Donata Pizzi Collection and a selection of prints from the archive of the UDI (Union of Italian Women) in Bologna, and Noi Donne, the UDI's historic magazine, which contains extensive documentation about the affirmation of women's rights, from the post-war period to the present day.

The selection elicits a reflection on two aspects of the photography of work: the documentation of reality in order to produce a social critique of the *status quo*, and the construction and reinterpretation of a certain representation of work by photography, a representation that intersects questions of ideology, aesthetic research and the relationship with the photographed subjects.

The spread of a feminist consciousness encouraged women to be more assertive in the workplace, while the development of the publishing industry and photojournalism offered new employment opportunities for women in sectors previously dominated almost exclusively by men. The greater portability of photographic equipment, which became lighter and more manageable during this period, made it easier for women to document life outside the photographic studio, among other things.

Early images describe a rural world disappearing from the north to the south of Italy; the reports of Lori Sammartino frequently feature women involved in manual labour, like the scenes of *Immagini dal mondo dei vinti* (1978) by Paola Agosti. In the years of the economic boom, agriculture contracted and many women expelled from the rural world found new jobs in the service and manufacturing sectors. Paola Agosti, in *La donna e la Macchina* (1983), also captured the testimony of women who distanced themselves from rural work to go into industry.

At the same time, in Palermo, Letizia Battaglia, the first woman to lead the photographic team of *L'Ora* newspaper, combined known works of reportage about the Mafia wars with ones that documented the life of women and children, including work life.

Images of tumultuous activism between 1968 and 1977 flow in and out of factories.

Gabriella Mercadini's black and white images of strikes, marches and protests enable us to relive moments heavy with feverish atmospheres, as do the unusual bright pink and red tones of the banners and placards that fill the streets in the colour photographs of Agnese De Donato.

From the Self

The theme of the search for the self between female identity and social roles has been at the centre of the artistic experimentation of many female photographers since the 1970s.

With different styles, Marcella Campagnano, Collettivo Donne Fotoreporter, Nicole Gravier and Alessandra Spranzi use a language that satirises the social roles usually attributed to women.

Female photographers turn their gaze onto an evolving society. Liliana Barchiesi reports on housewives and their domestic appliances, women who, with a smile, reflect on the issue of unpaid domestic work.

Cristina Omenetto looks at female migration and the experience of the young women who arrived in Italy in the 1990s; Michela Palermo focuses on the second generation of migrants in Italy.

The multimedia language of performances and videos shape the images of the series *Try* by Marilisa Cosello, a project that engages with a collective reflection about gender and the history of sport – for a long time women were excluded from most Olympic sports.

Not only work but also households changed:

in Italy, over 2.5 million households are single-parent, 86% of which are made up of children and single mothers.


This is a fast-growing phenomenon that Giada Ripa documents in diptychs accompanied by short interviews with other women who find themselves having to juggle a routine of work and motherhood.

The research space coincides with the relationship between self and world, with the awareness that 'the personal is political.'

To paraphrase Teresa de Lauretis, 'in the walled city of culture (...) only the incessant work of deconstruction and reconstruction carried out by women can define new physiognomies; for women and for art.'

The exhibition presents a generation of female photographers who emerged thanks to the radical transformations of Italian society from the 1950s, but who also made a fundamental contribution to these changes, through art and cultural representation.
