
With the exhibition *Nampula Macua Socialismo*, Manuel Santos Maia concludes 25 years of research into his family's relationship with Mozambique (where the artist was born in 1970) and with African cultures, particularly the Macua culture.

Since 1999, Manuel Santos Maia's *alheava* project has revisited the issues of colonialism and post-colonialism in the construction of contemporary Portuguese culture through visual narratives of intimate and domestic history. With dozens of exhibitions, performance actions and publications, *alheava* illuminates blind spots in the relationship between Mozambican society, the Portuguese who came from Africa, and the critical and constructive perspective of a shared collective past.

In Nampula Macua Socialismo, we sought to bring together collections of images from albums from the colonial period, contemporary photographic records of the city of Nampula, but also from a recent trip by the artist to the region (Angoche, Ilha de Moçambique, Chocas, Mossuril and Marrere), textile work (one of the pieces in dialogue with the architect Pancho Guedes), a bronze model of the 'house of first affections', objects from his private life, popular sculpture and music, as well as umbila wood planks dismantled from crates on the journey back to Europe during the decolonisation process.

At the opening of the exhibition, Manuel Santos Maia presents A Chave da Casa (Key to the House), a performance created for the opening, in which he embodies his paternal grandmother who lives in Nampula, a tutelary figure in the artist's upbringing in terms of sentiment and a worldview based on harmony.

In the year in which we celebrate the 50th anniversary of Mozambique's independence, against all forms of whitewashing of colonial memory and silencing, *Nampula Macua Socialismo*, located somewhere between visual anthropology and aesthetic essay, aims to contribute to a reflection on regimes of domination and conflict, cultural transits and hybridisations, the incessant processes of socialisation to which we are all heirs. It thus seeks to reconnect us with the cyclicality of time, the circularity of knowledge, the need for healing rituals that give us back an enlightened view of understanding the world and the ability to listen.
